#### ABOUT THE AMERICAN WOMEN QUARTERS™ PROGRAM

The American Women Quarters<sup>™</sup> Program is the first circulating coin program dedicated to honoring women whose achievements, triumphs and legacies reflect the strength, perseverance, and resiliency of our nation. Beginning in 2022, and continuing through 2025, the U.S. Mint will issue five new reverse designs each year on quarter dollars honoring prominent American women from a variety of fields, including, but not limited to, suffrage, civil rights, abolition, government, humanities, science, space, and the arts.

The National Women's History Museum is proud to serve as a consultant to the U.S. Mint on this inspiring project. In addition to participating in the honoree recommendation process, the Museum hosted an online portal for public feedback in which more than 11,000 submissions were received for consideration in the program.

The 2024 Celia Cruz Quarter is the 14<sup>th</sup> coin in the American Women Quarters<sup>™</sup> Program. Other coins in the program for 2024 include: Rev. Dr. Pauli Murray, poet, writer, activist, lawyer, and Episcopal priest; Patsy Takemoto Mink, first woman of color to serve in Congress; Dr. Mary Edwards Walker, Civil War-era surgeon, women's rights advocate, and the only woman to be awarded the U.S. Medal of Honor; and Zitkála-Šá, writer, composer, educator, and political activist.
